Instructions for Authors

Presenters will have the option of submitting their paper for publication in the on-line book series, Natural Resources and Environmental Issues, published the S.J. and Jessie E. Quinney Natural Resources Research Library on the Utah State University campus (<http://www.cnr.usu.edu/quinney/htm/publications/nrei>). The series is based on original monographic research and the editors will have each submission reviewed by one or more outside experts. This publication is fully accessible by internet search engines such as Google and Alta Vista. Color figures are acceptable. Hard-bound copies will be available for purchase.

To be considered for publication, manuscripts should be submitted to the proceedings to the editor on or before July 30th. Peer reviews will be completed within two months, and your final revisions that address the reviewers concerns will be due by November 30, 2008. Authors may choose to submit either a full manuscript or an extended, 1-page abstract (1 figure allowed).

Manuscript should be submitted in electronic format (Word, WordPerfect, RTF or TXT for text and TIFF, GIF or JPEG for figures) along with one hard copy. Before submission, authors should ensure that their manuscripts are concise, well written and free of typographical, grammatical and stylistic errors. Manuscripts must be in the English language. Papers should conform to the format recommended by Hydrobiologia (summarized below).

Organization of the Manuscript

Articles should be less than approximately 9000 words in length including text, tables, figures, and references. They should be arranged in the following order:

Title of Paper [title case and bold]

Full names of the authors [First Name Last Name (1) and First Name Last Name (2) etc]

Address of author including email address [(1) text, (2) text]

Abstract [one paragraph]

Introduction, Methods, Results and Discussion

Acknowledgements (if any)

References

Tables, figures, images etc. will be on separate sheets following the text.

Text

Text should be single spaced, in a 12-point size of standard fonts such as Times New Roman, Courier and Helvetica. First-order headings (Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussions, Conclusions) should be Flush Left, Title Case, and Bold with a space before and after. Second-order headings should be Flush Left, Sentence Case and spaced. Paragraphs should not be indented. Avoid using footnotes in the text. All illustrations and references must be cited in the text.

References [The Council of Biology Editors Style Manual is recommended for matters of style]

Text citation - The author-date system of reference citation should be used in the text. No punctuation is used between author and date. Use et al. for more than two authors. Multiple citations are separated by semicolons and arranged chronologically.

Reference List - The list of references should be arranged alphabetically by author and chronologically for each author. References will follow the style as given in the example below, i.e. journals are NOT abbreviated and only normal fonts are used (not bold, no italics, no indentations). Authors' name – use surname followed by initials for first author and initials followed by surname for all other authors (NOTE: We will be using a period between initials). Use the ampersand to indicate last author. Examples:

Benndorf, J., H. Schultz & S. Reichels. 1988. Food-web manipulation by enhancement of piscivorous fish stocks: Long-term effects in the hypertrophic Bautzen Reservoir. *Limnologica* 19: 97–110.

Berg, S., E. Jeppesen & M. Søndergaard. 1997. Pike (*Esox lucius* L.) stocking as a biomanipulation tool. 1. Effects on the fish population in Lake Lyng (Denmark). *Hydrobiologia* 342/343: 311–318.

Gliwicz, Z.M. & J. Pijanowska. 1989. The role of predation in zooplankton succession. In Sommer, U. (ed.), *Plankton Ecology*. Springer Verlag, London: 253–296.

Grimm, M.P. & J.J. Backx. 1990. The restoration of shallow eutrophic lakes and the role of northern pike, aquatic vegetation and nutrient concentration. *Hydrobiologia* 200/201: 557–566.

To document a file available for viewing and downloading via the World Wide Web, provide the following information: *Author's name (if known); *Date of publication or last revision; *Title of document; *Title of complete work (if relevant); *URL, in angle brackets; *Date of access; Examples:

Tables, Figures etc.

All tables and figure placements should be referred to by number in the text in normal font with a double space before and after the placement. The caption should appear at the bottom of the image in normal font and in sentence case. The tables and figures must be contained on separate pages following the text and should be named by table or figure # (i.e., Table 1, Table 2, Figure 3 etc.). Illustrations that require extensive formatting should be submitted as image files, using TIFF, GIFF, or JPEG formats and identified by table # in the file name. Each file should contain a single image. If possible, all illustrations should be originals and submitted in black and white. Authors are responsible for the quality of their illustrations.

Authors will not be provided with complimentary copies of their papers. Consent for online publication of each paper on the Quinney Library website will be assumed at the time of submission. Authors will not receive any royalties from prospective proceeds from the sale of the NREI publication containing these submissions.
